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Dear Parents,

I hope this letter finds you well. It has been a wonderful week at South Lee Prep School, with the sunshine bringing smiles to the children's faces as they enjoyed the warmth. The week began with some very tired, but happy pupils returning from the ski trip on Saturday afternoon. Their resilience, enthusiasm, and determination throughout the trip were truly commendable, and I could not be prouder of them.



Meanwhile, also on Saturday, Mr. M and Mrs. T accompanied a group of pupils to the East Anglian Prep Schools Cross Country Championship. A huge well done to all those who took part. On Monday, our pupils demonstrated their athleticism once again at another cross-country event, performing brilliantly.

Year 6 & 7 enjoyed an enriching day at Stansted Mountfitchet Castle, where they immersed themselves in history, bringing their studies to life. Later in the week, on Thursday evening, we were treated to a truly outstanding Tea Time Tunes concert. This was by far the best I have seen at South Lee, with an incredible variety of instruments and performances. My sincere thanks to Mrs. Combes and all our peripatetic music teachers for their dedication and support in making this such a special event.

Earlier this term, South Lee Prep School underwent an inspection by the Independent Schools Inspectorate (ISI) as part of their routine schedule. Unlike Ofsted reports, which provide an overall grade, the main school (Reception – Year 8) is assessed on whether it meets, or does not meet, the required standards. I am delighted to report that all areas within the main school have been judged as 'met.' The report is filled with wonderful and highly positive feedback, with one key finding stating:

"Leaders give pupils' well-being a high priority. As a consequence, a positive atmosphere prevails throughout the school, and pupils show high levels of self-confidence."

During their visit, inspectors also provided informal feedback, praising the Year 7 & 8 Active Leadership Programme, which encourages pupils to take on meaningful duties and responsibilities appropriate for their age. They were particularly impressed with how this initiative fosters leadership, teamwork, and a strong sense of service to the community—reinforcing our school's ethos of care and involvement.

Inspectors also highlighted the dedication and expertise of our staff, the high level of intellectual engagement in lessons, and the extensive extra curricular opportunities available to pupils. They commended the strong pastoral and safeguarding culture at South Lee, noting the personalised support provided by teachers and the impressive progress made by our pupils.

Regrettably, despite my considerable efforts—including formal complaints and numerous discussions with ISI and Ofsted regarding concerns over the nursery inspection process and inspector conduct —the judgement for our Nursery has been confirmed as 'Requires Improvement,' with the exception of Safeguarding, which was fully met. However, a positive outcome from this process is that ISI is now reviewing aspects of its inspection procedures in response to the feedback we have provided.

While this outcome is disappointing, there are many positives highlighted in the Nursery report, which I shared with the Nursery team earlier this week. Unfortunately, a few minor issues were given disproportionate weight, leading to the overall judgement. It is also very important to mention that the report states that the nursery is meeting all national standards and provides a high-quality foundation for learning.

It also states that the school takes early education seriously, and ensures children have all the key skills to move into main school. It is important to note that our Reception class, although part of the EYFS, was inspected under the main school.

However, I do not want this result from the nursery inspection to detract from the exceptional work being carried out across our whole school every day. We move forward with confidence, building on the strengths identified and continuing to provide the highest standard of education and care for our pupils.

Finally, the commitment of our staff across all areas of the school is what makes South Lee such a special place, and I am incredibly grateful for their dedication.
