Chef Rachel's Corner



I'm excited to share a delightful little recipe that's perfect for some half-term fun with your children. Whether you're teaming up in the kitchen or letting your older kids take the lead, this cool treat is sure to be a hit. Plus, it's a brilliant way to use up those overripe bananas in the warmer weather!

Banana 'Ice Cream'

Ingredients:

- 6 ripe bananas (or as many as you have!)
- A drizzle of honey
- A splash of milk



Let's Get Started:

- 1. Peel & Chop: Start by peeling your bananas and cutting them into chunks. This is a great job for little hands!
- 2. Freeze Time: Pop the banana chunks into a ziplock bag and place them in the freezer. Leave them overnight or until they're frozen solid.
- 3. Blitz Away: Once frozen, put the banana chunks into a food processor. Pulse them until they start to break down.
- 4. Add the Magic: Pour in a small splash of milk and a drizzle of honey. Continue blitzing until your mixture looks smooth and creamy, just like ice cream. Be careful not to over-blitz we want it to stay cool and creamy!
- 5. Taste Test: Give it a taste and add a bit more honey if you like it sweeter.
- 6. Enjoy: Scoop your banana ice cream straight into bowls and dig in, or transfer it to a tub to enjoy later.

Pro Tip: This treat is best enjoyed fresh, but if you do save some for later, it will keep in the freezer for a few hours.

Have a fantastic half-term and enjoy your homemade banana ice cream!
