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
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Dear Parents,

We are proud to share the remarkable achievement of one of our very own Year 2 pupils, Reuben T, who has embarked on an incredible journey of publishing his own stories. Reuben has always had a passion for storytelling, and it's been a joy to watch his imagination come to life over the years. When he was younger, Reuben would dictate his tales to his family, who would help him print them at home to share with relatives. Now, Reuben is independently bringing his stories to life, taking on the entire process with a level of creativity and dedication beyond his years.

Using his iPad, Reuben dictates his stories, and then sends the text to his mother, who runs her own publishing company. She helps him format and lay out the books, teaching him the skills needed to create a professional product. Together, they carefully select stock images or use image generation software to create the illustrations that accompany his words, ensuring that every book is as unique and imaginative as the stories themselves. Reuben's first two titles, The Lost Amulet and A Stone Age Adventure, are already available in print and ebook formats, and he is even working on creating audiobook versions for his readers who prefer listening to stories.

What makes Reuben's journey even more impressive is his generosity. He has committed to donating 40% of the profits from every book sold to support the PTA at South Lee. This wonderful act of giving back to the school community is a testament to Reuben's kind-hearted nature, and we are incredibly proud of his entrepreneurial spirit.

This initiative showcases not only Reuben's remarkable talent and drive but also his ability to turn his creative dreams into reality.
